Fostering animals for Wadars



At Wadars we are looking for people to support our rehoming work by fostering animals in their homes until new families can be found for them.



The fostering of animals from home is an extremely rewarding but often time-consuming role. As with all animal-related experiences, there are both happy endings and sad stories, but if you live within 10 miles of Worthing; have access to transport; and the time to spend looking after an animal, you could make a real difference.

Why should you do this?

Fostering animals is usually very rewarding, knowing that you have played a key role in the care and rehoming of homeless pets.

Benefits to the animals

Fostering can play a vital part in the rehabilitation of animals, and really helps to improve their chance of finding a new home. Living with a foster family helps to provide animals with one-to-one care and allows them to build up their confidence and get used to a normal lifestyle. Our fosterers help us to observe and evaluate the behaviour and progress of animals they look after to help the Animal Welfare Team make sure the pets are placed where they will fit in and lead happy lives.

How does animal fostering work?

Anyone interested in fostering will be visited by a member of our Animal Welfare Team to talk through what is needed and to ensure that the foster home is appropriate for the animal that they are hoping to foster (we foster-out dogs, cats, rabbits, and guinea pigs). We carry out home checks on potential foster homes



so that we can find the best match for the individual animals. The welfare of animals is always our top priority, so although qualifications are not necessary, some animal care experience is preferable.

Wadars will supply all of the food and equipment required, and pay for any veterinary treatment. All potential fosterers with their own pets must have their own animals vaccinated within the last 12 months and have a valid vaccination card before a Wadars animal can be placed with them. Access to transport is also essential to enable fosterers to take animals to the vet if necessary.
