Volunteer Cat Socialiser - role description

Purpose of role:

This role supports the work of our team of our Animal Care Assistants. Volunteers in this role will be asked to groom and provide enrichment/socialisation for the cats in our care.

Main activities:

- To spend time with individual cats in order to win their trust and help bring them out of themselves where necessary
- To get cats used to being groomed
- To provide enrichment as directed by Wadars animal care staff
- This role is likely to involve some liaison with members of the public who are interested in adopting a cat from Wadars



- Volunteers will need to be flexible in order to carry out this role as we will operate a rota system, but Wadars would expect volunteers to complete at least one 2-hour shift a fortnight
- Wadars asks that volunteers commit to their role for at least three months
- Cat socialising will only take place between the hours of 11am and 3pm, Tuesday to Sunday (outside of these hours won't be possible as cattery staff will be cleaning out and feeding animals)
- Volunteers may also be required to commit to attend a half day's training

Requirements:

- You must be aged 18 or over
- Some experience of handling animals would be an advantage
- You must follow Wadars policies and procedures for animal handling/welfare
- You must follow Wadars health and safety policies at all times
- You might be required to undertake follow-up or additional training deemed necessary to provide appropriate understanding and ability to fulfil the role

What you will get out of the role:

- The opportunity to help create a calm, friendly environment for cats in our care
- An insight into the frontline working of Wadars
- Experience of working as part of a highly dedicated team concerned with the welfare of animals
- Opportunities to get more involved with the work of Wadars
