



Thinking of adopting a Wadars cat?

All Wadars cats are neutered, vaccinated, treated for fleas and worms, microchipped and come to you with four weeks free health insurance.

Once you have chosen a cat by visiting them in the cattery or foster home (or, more likely, it has chosen you) he or she will be reserved for you whilst you make an appointment for a home check (which you can do by calling Wadars on 01903 247111). The home check must take place in the home where the cat is going to live.

The purpose of the home check is to discuss cat ownership with you and to ensure that you have made the right decision in adopting a cat. It is also the time when the wadars will discuss with you any special needs of the cat you have chosen.

Once both you and Wadars are satisfied, the adoption form has been completed and the adoption fee received, the cat can be released to you. You will need to visit the kennels/ fosterer once again to pick up the new member of your family. You must use a substantial metal or plastic cat carrier for transporting the cat; cardboard/wicker carriers are not acceptable. We can supply you with a suitable carrier for a donation of £5 if needed.

Please note: if you already have another cat or cats in your home they must be fully vaccinated (ie within the last 12 months) before a Wadars cat will be allowed to live with you. Evidence of vaccination must be available to the home checker on their first visit.

Two or three weeks after you have adopted the cat a follow-up home check will be arranged to see that all is well and ensure both the cat and you are happy together. If you have any concerns or are worried about the cat please call wadars for advice. All cats going into new homes must be confined to the house for a minimum of 21 days; windows, doors and cat flaps must be kept locked and covered and you should ensure that a litter tray is in place at all times.

Your accommodation

If you live in rented accommodation, the AWT will need to see written permission from the owner of the premises, agreeing to the adoption – this must be in place before a home visit can be arranged.

Financial Implications

There is an adoption fee for all Wadars animals. The amount varies depending on which animal you have chosen. This will be discussed with you at the home-check.

A large part of owning any animal is ensuring that all their needs are met. This includes veterinary treatment, food and housing. Please ensure that you have considered the full financial cost of owning an animal before you contact us.

Please note – the minimum age to adopt an animal from Wadars is 18 years.
