Some potential toxins

Lilies

Keep in mind that all parts of the plant are highly toxic to cats! Even small ingestions (such as 2-3 petals or leaves) – even the pollen or water from the vase – can result in severe, acute kidney failure.





Antifreeze

Even the smallest amount of antifreeze can cause kidney failure and death when ingested by cats. Remember even a tiny amount on a cat's feet (picked up if it walks through a spillage) is enough to harm it

Signs of antifreeze poisoning in cats include vomiting, a sleepy or depressed demeanour, a drunk-like and uncoordinated state, as well as seizures and difficulty breathing.

Daffodils

Can cause stomach upsets, vomiting, or worse if your cat eats the foliage, flowers or pods.





Permethrin

Used in some flea spot-on products made for dogs, and occasionally (in lower doses) in flea powders and collars for cats. Unfortunately, exposure to concentrated permethrin (as in some dog spot-ons) can result in serious illness and even death in cats.
